Introduction

Hi everyone. This is our third Newsletter – I hope all are safe and well!

179th Anniversary

Firstly, let's acknowledge that 179 years ago today when the six Fahey brothers (Thomas, William, Peter, Edward, Timothy and James) arrived in Sydney (on 7th September 1841) having departed from Liverpool, England on board the "United Kingdom". The six brothers (children of John Fahey & Honor Ruhon a/k/a Ruane) had all been born in Ballymacward Galway Ireland. On their departure from Ireland both parents were deceased. The brothers had been sponsored by A.B. Smith & Co. who imported labourers, domestic servants and tradesmen to Sydney & Melbourne offering emigrants free passage for themselves and their families in return for providing their services to those already in the colony for a particular period of time. Those who employed these emigrants paid A.B. Smith & Co. the cost of passage to Australia. This was known as assisted immigration. The length of time to be served depended on the cost of their passage to Australia. For example, a single young person might only be required to work for 3 to 6 months whereas a family might be required to work for a year or more. This ship was at the time the largest merchant ship ever to come to the colony registering upwards of 1,200 tons with 482 emigrants.
